Dear Member:

Since you received our last letter regarding the regrassing of the greens, our team of Kandi Comer, Tim Thomas, and course architect John LaFoy have been very busy evaluating the process. While *agronomic* issues behind green regrassing are fairly simple and will eliminate many potential turf grass problems, the *overall planning and implementation* of such a project is laced with hard work, sleepless nights, and a little uncertainty. To limit the uncertainty and anticipate problems, they have talked with several country clubs throughout the area that have gone through similar regrassing projects. These conversations turned out to be valuable, as there is no substitute for experience, and clubs kindly shared their methods and results. Every club had one common recommendation: create as good of a growing environment as humanly possible (e.g. Tim's installation of fans near the greens on holes 8 and 11). In addition, they agreed that the waiting period for germination was the most gut-wrenching aspect of the project. Our research phase completed, we began to move forward with practical considerations.

John LaFoy's scope of work for the regrassing included fumigation, removing three inches of soil, filling the three inches with new sand and amendments, grading, and regrassing. In addition, it included the conversion of the existing #2 fairway bunker into a grass hollow and smaller bunker that will be designed by John and completed by the contractor. The completed scope of work was sent to a few well-known, reputable contractors across the country. With John's recommendation, we have decided to enter into a contract with Landscapes Unlimited, the Nebraska-based contractor who built the Glenmore course sixteen years ago. In other words, we have re-established the original team that worked together so well to bring you the golf course you have come to know and enjoy. We feel fortunate to be able to get on Landscapes's schedule to complete this project; they are a sought-after company with a solid reputation, and we are excited for them to start work on July 7.

In the coming months you will see updates about agreements with other clubs for playing privileges and pricing, private cart agreements, golf outings, and golf clinics. All of our correspondence concerning the regrassing and subsequent off-site and on-site golf events will arrive under green cover.
